




Figure 1-1: A diagram showing Amazon's ecosystem.




Figure 2-1: My writing workflow is shown in black. Editing is in gray. ianallanauthor.com/scribe




Figure 2-2: The searchable PDF on the left. Converted text on the right. ianallanauthor.com/scribe





Figure 2-3: My editing workflow is in black. My writing workflow is in gray. ianallanauthor.com/scribe




Figure 2-4: The amazon.com/sendtokindle dialog box. ianallanauthor.com/scribe




Figure 5-1: The Home screen and Library screen.

5.2 How to read a Book




Figure 5-2: The Scribe's Swipe zones and Tap zones.




Figure 5-3: The Quick actions toolbar.




Figure 5-4: The Standard Toolbar.

Swipe down from the top of the screen to see the Quick actions toolbar (Figure 5-3). Tap the top of the screen to see the Standard toolbar (Figure 5-4). Tap on the left side of the screen for the previous page, and the right side of the screen for the next page. Tap the bottom left of the screen to toggle through your reading progress information. 


Figure 7-1: The Aa icon launches the Display Settings box. ianallanauthor.com/scribe.




Figure 9-1: The 'create a notebook or folder' dialog. ianallanauthor.com/scribe




Figure 9-2: Tap the three dots to manage your notebook ianallanauthor.com/scribe




Figure 9-3: The six options in a notebook's main toolbar. ianallanauthor.com/scribe




Figure -1: The handwriting and drawing floating toolbar. You can select a tool with either your finger or the Scribe's pen. ianallanauthor.com/scribe.




Figure 13-1: The Kindle cloud reader - library mode. ianallanauthor.com/Scribe..
